The following is taken from the 500 words website:

At 500 Words, we want children to have fun writing their stories, be as creative as they can and make us laugh, cry or just be blown away by what we are reading. **Children are encouraged to write a story they would love to read themselves.** Over the years there have been incredible stories submitted. Children can only submit one story each. There are very few rules on 500 Words but a few points to remember:

All the stories must:

- □ **Be 500 words or less** (title is not included in the number)
- □ Be written by an individual and not a group
- □ Be a child's own original idea
- $\hfill\square$ Be prose, not rap or poem

Stories must not:

- □ Give any personal details of the child, including their name
- □ Recount an historical event (but they can use a real person or historical character as a source of inspiration)
- $\hfill\square$ Be created, written or developed by AI






