

Lenny Henry

This week in our worship, we heard the story of Lenny Henry and his life as part of our weekly theme, 'serving by standing up for what you believe in.' We looked at his life through the book series, 'Little People, Big Dreams'. From his work in comedy to setting up Comic Relief, Lenny Henry's work has celebrated Black culture and helped raise millions of pounds for those in need. Lenny has continued to demonstrate his belief that 'if you can see it, you can be it' and has studied English literature and screenwriting at a later age. Lenny was in his sixties when he published his first children's book.
